John, Hope you had a nice weekend... chilly temps good for the electric utility business! I, for one, sure appreciate the lights going on and the heat-pump purring whenever needed. This past week, I had the opportunity to attend the SRP Sustainability Plan Road Show held at Poly Tech here in Mesa. And had a chance to speak with most of the "Subject Matter Experts" in attendance (someday I'd like to grow up and be a SME, too!). In preparation, I put together some notes, data, pictures, articles, calculations, etc. to share with the SRP experts. And I asked my one question, "Why are we doing this"? Yes, I know the Fed is providing "free money", money that you and I provide via taxes or, worse yet, come from the increasing national debt to which we're passing on to our children. Did you know, the interest alone is \$100,000 per second? Equally important is the environmental impact that this plan will have. It is absolutely obscene and, quite frankly, not at all necessary. The first Poster at the event spoke to "energy efficiency" with a goal of reducing generation by 300 MWh. The rising cost of electric power will achieve that goal, if not more, but that is NOT energy efficiency. I'd like to introduce a new term, Environmental Efficiency. And it, too, can be measured in MWh. In the attachment, there is a list of grid size solar projects planned for the western US. Their average Environmental Efficiency is 1.1 MWh per acre. Palo Verde, on the other hand, is 20 MWh per acre. As a nuke plant, they require a large land buffer. But the winner, hands down, is the SRP SanTan Generating Station at over 80 MWh per acre! So, the common sense question is "why are we not doing more of this"? I will say, one "SME" did respond with "well, we have plenty of land". I think that's about the same mind-set that the folks in Ohio had with respect to water, before they set the Cuyahoga River on fire. Inclusivity. I see that all the time all over the place, including SRP literature. So, why are Native Americans excluded, again? Yes, there are lots of concerned faces, words, meetings, etc. yet, at the end of the day, the Natives lose again. SunZia is just the latest example. Then, there is the "settled science". Let's consider these: #1 Human annual power consumption is equivalent to the energy the Earth receives from the Sun in just ONE hour. That's a factor ~9000X! So maybe the sun has something to do with climate change? #2 According to the law of conservation of energy, energy cannot be created or destroyed, although it can be changed from one form to another. All of life on Planet Earth owes its existence to the sun. Extending this logic would then

demonstrate that fossil fuels are merely stored solar energy. #3 Math & Reality can be at odds. Consider, the average human baby, at birth, is ~18" long & weighs ~7 lbs. During the first 6 months of life, the average baby gains 8 pounds and grows 5" during the first 6 months of life. Given an average life span of 75 years, extrapolating this scientific data, the average human being, at death, would weigh ~1,200 pounds and be ~62.5 feet tall. 4. **Questionable Timing and Justification** SRP should provide clear, transparent justification for why a rate hike is necessary. Are there inefficiencies within the company's operations that could be addressed before passing costs to consumers? Additionally, Arizona's extreme climate and growing reliance on electricity for cooling make energy affordability a critical issue, especially during peak summer months.
5. **Missed Opportunity for Innovation** Rather than raising rates, SRP could explore alternative revenue-generating strategies that do not disproportionately impact residential customers. These might include diversifying their energy portfolio, expanding renewable energy initiatives, or implementing demand-side management programs that lower costs for both the company and its customers.
6. **Public Backlash and Trust** Frequent or poorly justified rate increases erode public trust in utilities. Customers expect SRP to act as a responsible public service provider, not merely a revenue-driven entity. Without proper justification or customer engagement, SRP risks damaging its reputation and facing increased scrutiny from regulators and advocacy groups.

In conclusion, raising residential electricity rates is neither economically nor socially sustainable. SRP should prioritize affordability and equitable access to energy while exploring innovative ways to improve operational efficiency and maintain revenue without overburdening Arizona's residents.

Your price process documents for the proposed E-28 plan do not have either of these statements and make no mention of their deletion from the proposed E-28. The proposed E-28 states that the currently in effect winter on-peak kWh price is \$0.3633. Judging by the statements of the in effect E-28 plan, this price is generally not true and is completely untrue for a customer whose November bill starts on November 1 and ends on November 30. It seems that the information published in the Blue Book is erroneous and corrected Blue Books should be immediately published or an errata inserted at page 96 in the existing books before further distribution.

Hello, I am a customer with residential Solar and am on the E-27 pricing plan. It appears that SRP has proposed a 5.9% price increase for next year, a larger increase than for most plans. I think this unfairly penalizes solar customers. Even more concerning, though, is the plan to sunset the E-27 plan in favor of E-16, which has later peak hours (5-10 pm). I made a major capital investment in my home based on returns calculated on the E-27 plan structure. With the later peak hours, the benefit of our investment will be negated. We manage our demand primarily by controlling AC temperature settings in the summer and allowing the home temperature to rise from sunset until the rate changes at 8:00 PM. By 8:00 PM, our home is uncomfortably warm, but this was our decision. Following the same strategy but delaying cooling until 10:00 PM would make the home unbearably hot. We would therefore continue cooling throughout the peak period (5-10 PM) and would therefore have high demand and subsequent demand charges. We would therefore use more power than we currently use today between 5 and 8 PM in order to manage demand between 8 and 10 PM as the home heats up. I do not believe this increased peak-period power-use is consistent with SRP's objectives. Even with our best efforts to control demand with E-16, our costs will increase from today's values substantially. It is difficult to project "how much" with accuracy, but I would not be surprised if our bills DOUBLE. We had investigated battery storage to reduce peak-period demand, but capital costs are too high, and we simply cannot afford to install enough battery capacity to eliminate our demand. In summary, I think the current plan unfairly targets the small number of solar customers being serviced by SRP. We would not have installed solar if we knew of these plans. Please reconsider both the extent of the proposed price increase and the sunsetting of E-27.

Currently, the E-27 plan has more reasonable on peak of 2-8PM during summer months which more overlaps when rooftop solar generates (at least until 5pm). The new plan being 5-10pm on peak means that no matter what, our solar panels will rarely provide any benefit during those times. Solar now only generates mostly during Super Off Peak which is little benefit. Furthermore, you removed net metering, which negates the payback of solar as well. Why should we provide power to you at less than the rate you charge us? For EVs, most people charge their vehicles overnight. You have made it so that "off-peak" higher rates are almost double what they are now during those periods. Most people can't charge during the day since they are at work. On top of that, you changed the demand system to average demand, with significantly higher demand rates. The tiered system was more fair for those with lower demands (4-5KW). Please reconsider the impact to your rooftop solar and EV clients.

SRP pays me about 4 cents per KWhr for the power I provide to the network, but charges me about 8 cents per KWhr for the power that I consume. SRP sends out literature encouraging me to pay extra to support their own solar initiative. (SRP calls it "Lowering my carbon footprint." This strikes me as obtuse. When I spent the approximately \$10,000 for the solar collector system on my home, I did it knowing full well that it would not reduce my power bills to zero. I did it to lower my carbon footprint and to hedge my power bills against rate increases. It has done that. Dear Members of the Salt River Project Board,

I am writing to express my concerns regarding the proposed rate increase scheduled for next year and to advocate for fairer policies toward residential solar customers.

Historical Rate Increases:

Over the past decade, SRP has implemented several rate increases that have significantly impacted customers:

November 2022: A 4.7% rate increase, resulting in an average monthly bill rise of \$5.58.

November 2023: An additional 4.7% increase was approved; however, due to escalating costs, the actual increase was adjusted to 9.6%, leading to an average monthly bill increase of approximately \$11.88.

These consecutive increases have placed a considerable financial burden on customers, especially those on fixed incomes.

Challenges Faced by Solar Panel Owners:

As a homeowner who invested in rooftop solar panels with the expectation of reducing energy costs and contributing to environmental sustainability, I have encountered several challenges:

1. **Inadequate Compensation for Excess Energy:** The compensation for surplus energy generated by my solar panels is substantially lower than the rate at which SRP charges for electricity consumption. This disparity undermines the financial viability of investing in renewable energy.
2. **Mandatory Time-of-Use (TOU) Program:** The compulsory enrollment in a TOU program, where peak usage periods coincide with higher rates, has further diminished the anticipated savings from my solar investment.
3. **Restrictions on Energy Storage Solutions:** The prohibition against integrating battery storage systems prevents homeowners from optimizing energy usage and

alleviating grid demand during peak periods.

These policies not only discourage the adoption of renewable energy but also appear to discriminate against solar customers. Notably, in January 2024, Vote Solar filed a complaint with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, asserting that SRP's residential solar rates violate the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act by imposing discriminatory fixed charges and offering below-cost compensation for excess energy.

Request for Consideration:

In light of these concerns, I respectfully request the following:

Reevaluation of the Proposed Rate Increase: Given SRP's reported net revenues ranging from \$16 million to \$173 million over the past decade, I urge the Board to reconsider the necessity of an additional rate hike, considering the financial strain on customers.

Implementation of Equitable Policies for Solar Customers: Develop fair compensation structures for excess energy, offer flexible rate plans, and permit the use of battery storage systems to empower customers to manage their energy consumption effectively.

By addressing these issues, SRP can demonstrate its commitment to supporting renewable energy adoption and ensuring equitable treatment for all customers.

Thank you for considering my concerns. I look forward to your response and hope for a resolution that aligns with the best interests of the community and the environment.

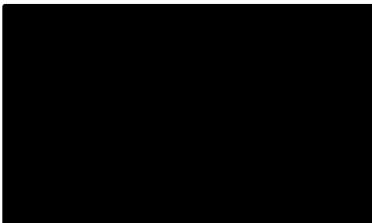

This information request is about SRP's guiding pricing principle of "choice", offering to customers multiple price plans and programs to choose from, and the important role SRP fills in helping customers understand the choices and their respective costs.

First, some numbered statements I found today on srpnet.com:

S1. From the "Learn about the public pricing process" 2025 webpage:

"How the Board decides on prices / These are the principles the Board follows when making pricing decisions: [5th and final bullet point] Choice - Pricing options should be provided to help customers manage their energy costs."

S2. The Blue Book, page 46:

"Management is proposing to freeze the old suite of TOU hour price plans as seen in Table 6." and said table lists 9 residential plans and 1 general service plan, 10 total.

S3. From the 2019 price process, a slide shown by management to the board states:

"Today - Customers have the ability to call SRP, and if there is adequate history a price comparison will be given over the phone. • Prospective solar customers can access SRP's MyAccount web portal to compare their current price plan to E-27.

Future - SRP is currently developing a price plan comparison tool. This feature will be made available in SRP's MyAccount web portal by spring of 2020."

S4. A media.srpnet.com page dated May 20, 2021 states:

"SRP's My Account also offers price plan comparison, which gives customers the ability to compare their actual costs on their current price plan and see how their home's energy usage might look like on another price plan option. It's like comparing the best and most cost-effective insurance plan."

S5. An srpnet.com pdf entitled "Salt River Project (SRP) Integrated System Plan

Advisory Group Meeting #14 - Summary” for a meeting held Sep 8, 2023 states:

“As a starting point, we have different price plan comparison tools and calculators online, and call center representatives are available and happy to walk through plans with people.”

S6. An srpnet.com pdf named “SRP Business Resource Guide” states:

“Contact your Strategic Energy Manager for a personalized price plan comparison.”

S7. SRP webpages for these plans - EZ-3 Plan, TOU Plan, EV Plan, Daytime Saver Plan, TOU Plan for Business - make this type of statement:

“If your first three bills on [plan name] aren’t lower than what you would have paid with the [non-TOU plan like the Basic Price Plan], we’ll credit you the difference and switch you back.” An SRP press release calls this “a 90-day risk-free guarantee”.

Some questions of mine in regard to the above numbered statements by SRP:

Q1. Regarding S3, as an SRP customer with solar, I can say that there is no feature in MyAccount to compare my current price plan to E-27. When was it added//turned on? When was it removed/turned off? And why was it removed? When will it be restored? In other words, a history of its availability, please.

Q2. Regarding S3 and the price plan comparison tool being available in MyAccount by the spring of 2020, when was it made available? And any times it was removed/turned off or added back/turned on?

Q3. Regarding S3 and “adequate history”, how many bills/months do you consider to be adequate?

Q4. Regarding S4, I called SRP Customer Service on Dec 4, and the representative said that the MyAccount price plan cost comparison feature for customers without interconnected solar was removed around the spring of 2024. Why?

Q5. In the SRP statements above, SRP did not disclose that, for customers with interconnected solar/DG, it does not currently offer any My Account comparison. Why? It is understood that because you chose in the 2019 price process to switch from the annual net metering arrangement for grandfathered solar and E-27’s monthly net metering to an exported kWh price approach in E-13, E-14, E-15, that modeling the behind-the-meter consumption of solar output is not near as simple as calculating a plan’s cost of kWh and kW based on a solar customer’s past history, but this fact was well known by your staff before you made the above written statements to the Board of Directors and the public. In cost comparisons for customers with interconnected solar, have you attempted to use the solar production data from the Dedicated DER Meter you require to be installed with every interconnected solar system? For customers who are considering adding interconnected solar, have you attempted to use PVWatts solar production data for the metropolitan part of your service territory?

Q6. In light of the SRP statements cited above, what are SRP’s in-place plans and projected availability dates to provide price plan cost comparison for customers with

solar/DG? Please describe any limitations or phased releases of the comparison functionality.

Q7. Regarding the S5 statement in Sep 2023, “we have different price plan comparison tools and calculators online, and call center representatives are available”, what are all the tools and calculators, both online for customers and only available to SRP employees, the tool or calculator name, the URL if available to customers, the customer types or classes available to, the date ranges the tool or calculators have been available, the time granularity of the data e.g. how many minutes, hours or days does the kWh data represent, the length of the period calculated e.g. in years, etc.? Sounds like a table would be the best way to provide this information.

Q8. Regarding S7, the “90 day guarantee” of savings, what is the total list of price plans with this type of offer from SRP? And for the residential plans it is not offered for, why not?

Q9. The Blue Book’s proposed adjustments will result in an increase in the number of plans available for a residential customer to choose from, and the plans offer a greater diversity in variables for the customer to consider. The adjustments will also result in a short timeframe of about 8 months for customers to choose a possible lower cost plan before 10 legacy plans are frozen from new participation and will no longer be an option they can choose. What is management’s plan, in detail and including timeframes please, to assist customers in making an informed choice about the cost of the various plans?

Q10. The 2025 price process content available at srpprices.com does not mention “price plan comparison” or the like. Why?

Q11. Regarding S1 -“Pricing options should be provided to help customers manage their energy costs.” - how else does SRP inform customers of what their bills would have been on the various applicable price plans, if not already addressed by the above questions?

Q12. What has been written at SRP or written to SRP about price plan comparison and the like since the beginning of the prior price process in 2018? Please provide electronic copies of these communications.

Please feel free to add any pertinent details that these questions do not address. And please take your time to be sure to thoroughly answer all the questions. I have already received one response that is not responsive to my questions and comments, so we’ll have to do it all over again.

Here are my concerns. * I am currently on the 'EZ-3' plan and did not see it mentioned specifically in your letter. Is this one of the current plans slated to be eliminated by 2029? * Please define 'very large electric service entrance'. * My current MSC is \$20.00. Is that going to stay the same? * Finally, I'd like to propose a plan to reduce residential consumption and would request your assistance to bring it to fruition. It is a widely proven fact that light surfaces reflect heat and subsequently reduce HVAC electric costs. All my experiences in construction within IBM, Motorola, and others - we always had the bldg. roofs either painted white or covered with reflective ballast. Az. houses are a 'sea of red roofs' and consequently they are not only hotter inside, but contribute to the 'heat island' effect everywhere. I've tried to get our HOA to allow residents to paint the roofs white - but - they cite a state 'BLANKET' law requiring 99% of the residents MUST request any change to the CCR's... The law was intended to prevent a slim (ie: 51%) of the residents from selling out to a developer for commercial purposes and leaving the remaining 49% - SOL! The intent was good but - the state went to far because it was too broad of a scope - not every change is bad and not every change should require a 99% vote approval. As a result, not even 'good' improvements have a chance of getting that kind of a majority - UNLESS, there is an incentive! This is where SRP could make a difference. What about creating a 'usage plan' that rewards folks who paint thier roofs white. My solar and demand management system work better than expected, but my savings are not quite what they should be because of the way the demand fees are structured. This does not feel equitable particularly given how I use these systems. I figure the trade-off for being able to have solar and save money with the E27 plan is that I both level out my home's demand reducing the peaks in my demand significantly and contribute to an overall reduction in the peaks on demand across SRP. I have my demand management system set up fairly aggressively to do just that, but my bills don't truly reflect that effort due to the way the fees or charges come together with the plan. So, I feel I am providing a greater benefit to SRP than I am receiving in return. I have ideas for how a balance could be had, but the bottom line is that I think SRP should reward people who truly use demand management systems to reduce the peaks they see and have to accommodate in demand sort of regardless of the inclusion of solar. I certainly thought having both solar and the demand management system would result in more savings especially when the systems perform above what was promised by the installer and original equipment manufacturer. Everything I'm seeing in the Cost Allocation Study is broken down by price plan with no reference to tiers (unless I'm missing something). Although I can easily see an argument for different costs to connect to new construction single-family homes vs. new construction apartments--for example, more and longer feeders for homes, but larger feeders and metering distribution enclosures for apartments--I am failing to see how existing single-family homes would be more expensive to maintain service to than existing apartments. (If anything, I'd expect apartments with individual unit metering will incur more customer service costs as residents continually move in and out, generating more service start and stop requests). If it is related primarily to the size of service drop (as suggested on pg. 10 Selected Electric Utility Trends, Concentric Energy Advisors 2-2-24), then MSCs should be based on service drop size rather than residence type (so the proposed plan could have 2 tiers: 225A or less and above 225A, or 3 tiers: 100A or less, 101-225A, and above 225A).

Let me just say right up front that a jump in MSC from \$20 to \$30 for the majority of customers who own single family homes is not gradual. That is a 50% price hike, and that's bad. Based on the proposed E-16 price changes it seems my annual price increase is atleast 3X times the E-15 plan or by approximately \$600 annually for our Home. Your proposed plan indicates the intended increase for non solar & battery customers is about +- inflation however for solar & battery customers it is steep increase, 300% for from E-15 to E-16 in my case. Why is this disparity? Also changing peak hours in TOU from 2 to 8 pm to 5 to 10 pm is a drastic shift. This requires perhaps additional battery or batteries to stay in the demand plan because of lack of solar during that time.
